#### Principal's Report

Since the start of the year I have enjoyed the opportunity to visit all the classes, witnessing quality learning experiences and engaged students. We are very lucky at Tingha Public School to have teachers who are committed to providing our students with a quality education whilst supporting their wellbeing needs.

#### PBL Respectful behaviour- fortnightly lessons

Positive Behaviour for Learning linked to learner qualities continues to be implemented in 2020. This is a whole school system that supports student's wellbeing and academic achievement. Tingha Public School encourages its students to always be "Totally Proud and Strong in a Safe and Respectful way. The current PBL focus is 'Respectful' learning behaviours. Students have been explicitly taught what this means, along with looks like, sounds like and feels like in the school setting. When your child/ren return home at the end of the school day you can reinforce this quality by asking them how they showed they were a **respectful learner** today.
