With the warmer weather fast approaching, we would like to take the opportunity to remind you that headlice will be more active. Please check your child/rens hair on a regular basis.



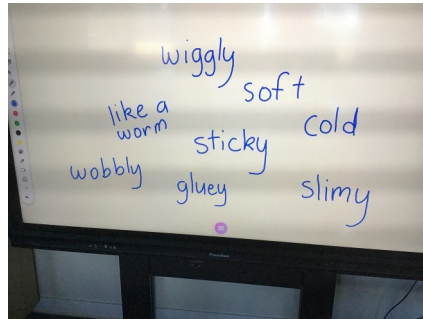
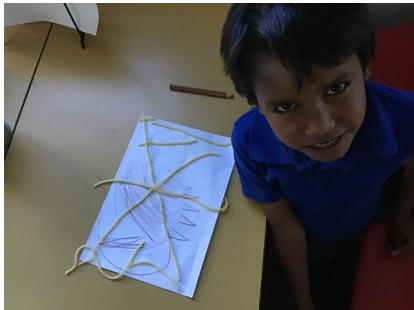

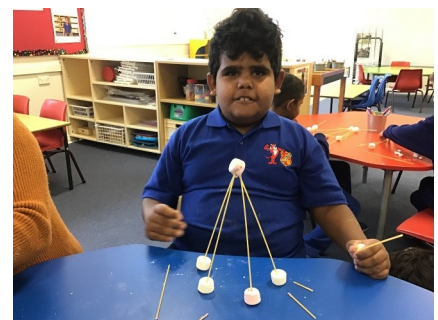
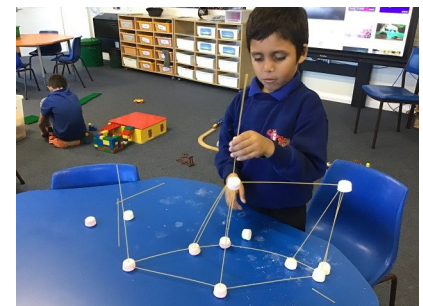
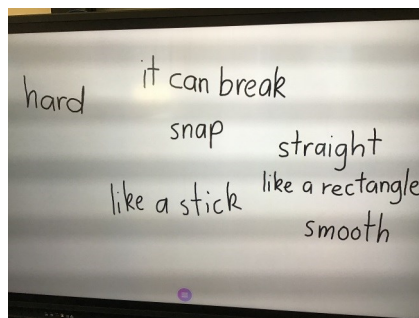
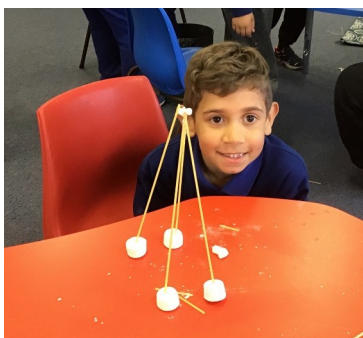


In science we are learning about the different ways food changes.
