Small Schools Sport and Cross Country

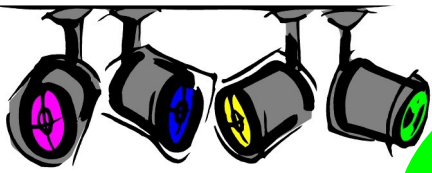

Canteen is available to all with a limited menu.

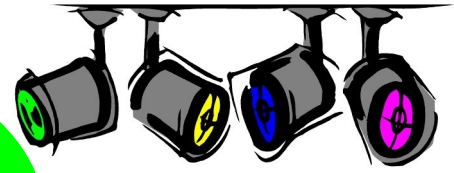
As always we look forward to another great fortnight at Tingha Public School and witnessing students becoming 'strong' and 'respectful' with their learning.

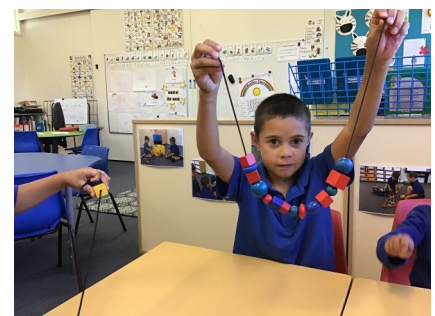
Created some shade

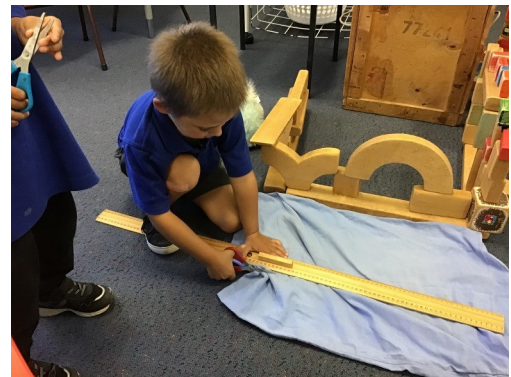

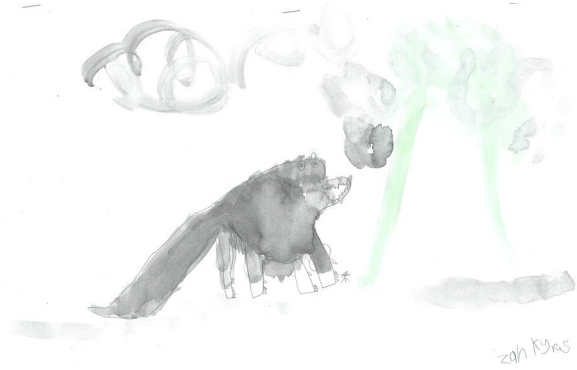


All animals snug and warm.

Parents if you are wanting to come to the canteen to order lunches please be advised you are to sign in at the office with a QR Code and sign the visitor register before visiting the canteen.

Order forms were sent home for students today for the Cross Country on Wednesday. As you will see by the order form our normal menu will not be available for this day only. A limited amount of food will be available for purchase by spectators for lunch. Please be aware we are operating with limited help in the canteen, this may result in long queues waiting to be served.
