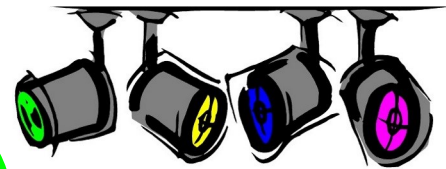
It is hard to believe that there is only four weeks until the school holidays. What a busy term of learning we have had!!

Headlice are once again making the rounds among our students. Please check your child's/children's hair and treat if necessary. Your co-operation is greatly appreciated.

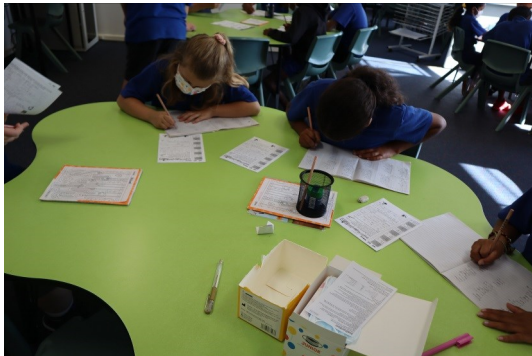


SPOTLIGHT ON 4/5/6

Throughout the day many opportunities happen that allow the students to engage in physical activities. Handball, soccer and golden child are just a few of their favourites.

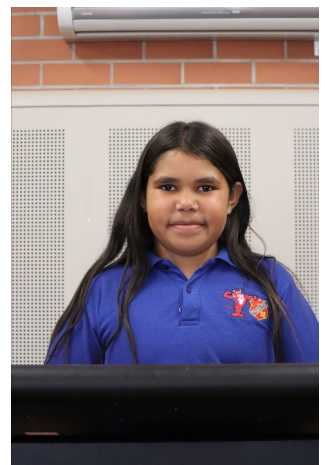
Even wearing face masks did not hindered their enthusiasm.

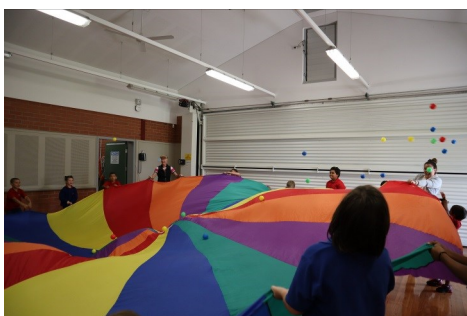
